About the Conference

Unorganized sector is generally a larger source of employment for women than for men in the developing world. These women workers deserve a separate mention as they are much marginalized and invisible who might not be 'working' in the narrow definition of work, are still engaged in productive labor. They contribute the major part of the income especially in the poor families and their contributions are most essential in the survival of the family. Researches show that they suffer from many types of occupational health problems, lead difficult lives and spend maximum time in arduous work at work place and at home. So, a serious look at the scenario of

women workers in unorganized sector is required. The present conference will bring together activists and thinkers from multiple fields e.g. social welfare, extension, academic, administration and research to share their expertise and experiences to deliberate over the various dimensions of the issue to find some practical, effective and novel ways for the betterment of women workers in unorganized sector.

Objectives

- To review and address the issues, challenges, multi-dimensional roles of women engaged in unorganized sector.
- To review the training needs so that emerging job opportunities can be properly availed by women engaged in unorganized sector.
- To suggest ways for further strengthening the employment opportunities, recognizing the economic roles and upliftment of women workers engaged in unorganized sector.
- To search out new ways, approaches, integrated strategies for enhancing and improving the occupational conditions.
- To provide a support network for those working towards welfare of women.
- To establish measures that can eliminate or reduce health hazards and risks.

Sub Themes

1. Economic roles played by women engaged in home based work, self employment, small scale entrepreneurship, agricultural and allied work, plantation, domestic, construction, craft, waste picking, beedi and cigar making, vending, garment making, handloom, beauty parlor, nursing, driving, sweeping, scavenging, tannery, rickshaw pulling, food processing and coolie related work etc.
2. Occupational environment, occupational health problems, diseases and accidents suffered by women workers in unorganized sector.
3. Physiological, biomechanical stress and musculoskeletal disorders and role of ergonomics for women workers in unorganized sector.
4. Globalization and unorganized women workers.
5. Vulnerable groups i.e. physically challenged; elderly, migrant and HIV/AIDS affected women in the unorganized sector.
6. Quality of living and incidences of poverty of women workers in the unorganized sector.
7. Protection and promotion of livelihood, capacity building and empowerment of women workers in unorganized sector.
8. Technology and drudgery reduction of women workers and women friendly innovations in unorganized sector.
9. Health care services and women workers in unorganized sector.
10. Role of local, national and international organizations/agencies working in the promotion of safety, health and welfare of women engaged in unorganized sector.

Guidelines for Abstract Submission

Academicians, professionals, research scholars, students, industry experts and NGOs are invited to Email (wwoh2018apg@gmail.com) their abstracts (Oral /Poster Presentation) not exceeding 500 words on any of the aforesaid sub themes of the conference before 15th February, 2018. Abstract should be **Typed** in Ms-Word, **Spacing-** Single, **Font-** Times New Roman, **Title-Bold** (Font Size 14), **Author(s) Name(s)** (Font Size 12, including official address, email and contact number) and **Abstract Text** (Font Size 10). Abstract should include objectives, methodology, results, conclusions and keywords along with **Sub Theme, Scanned Passport Size Photograph** and **Brief Professional Bio-Data (7--8 Lines)** of the author. The name of the presenting author should be underlined, along with his/her email and contact number.

Guidelines for Full Paper Submission

Length of paper may be limited to 2000-2500 words typed in MS Word in Times New Roman (Font size 12 with 1.5 Spacing) on A-4 size paper with portrait layout and 1" margin on all sides. This should include Introduction, Methodology, Results and Discussion, Conclusions and References. All Headings and Sub-Headings should be in Title Case form in bold in Times New Roman with font size 12 and placed left aligned. Sub-sub-headings should be in Sentence Case. All tables and figures should be referred as Table 1 and Fig 1 in the text. Table Title should be given above the table and Figure Title should be given below the figure in Title Case. Data in Table should be in single line spacing. References in the text should be given by author(s)'s sir name(s), followed by year in parenthesis (**Rose 1992**) in Title Case. The full references should be given at the end in alphabetical order as per the examples given below:
